Why Agreement Matters

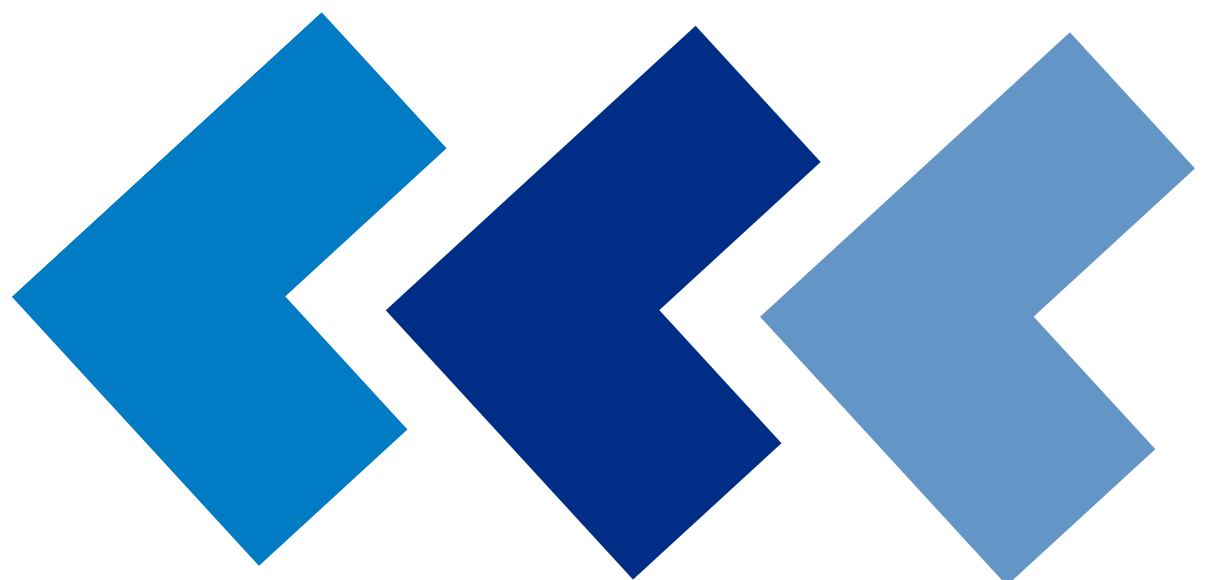
When leaders and consultants disagree on primary goals, sessions become unproductive.
